

# STE. ROSE SCHOOL COMMUNITY REPORT. 2017-18



## **OUR MISSION STATEMENT: GIVING OUR BEST TO HELP STUDENTS BECOME THEIR BEST.**

Ste. Rose School serves a student body from a mainly agricultural population. Just over half of our students travel by bus to school from the surrounding rural area while the remainder live within town limits. As of June 2018, Ste. Rose School houses 235 students from Kindergarten to Senior 4. Our student population has self-declared 44% to be of aboriginal descent. We have a staff of 20 teachers and 12 support staff and provide a full academic program. The school offers a wide range of extra-curricular activities including athletics, senior band, yearbook, breakfast program. Ste. Rose School has an active parent committee and student council.

## **SCHOOL PRIORITIES**

1. Each teacher will use multicultural teaching to incorporate multi-cultural perspective at least twice in the 2017-18 school year.
2. Ste. Rose School will maintain Green Team in Grades K-8 and complete two new projects in 2017-18 school year while maintaining current practices.
3. Ste. Rose School will participate in two mental health workshops to address mental health needs in the school by June 2018.
4. Ste. Rose School staff will engage in small group instruction in their lessons. School administration will observe small group instruction twice per teacher by June 2018.

## **PRIORITIES**

1. Eighty three percent of Ste. Rose Staff used multi-cultural perspective twice in the classroom. Fifty-six percent of Ste. Rose Staff used multi-cultural perspective in class once.
2. Ste. Rose School completed two additional green team projects.

4. Eighty Nine percent of Ste. Rose Staff were observed using small group instruction in the 2017-18
