## OUR MISSION STATEMENT:

Ste. Rose School serves a student body from a mainly agricultural population. Just over half of our students travel by bus to school from the surrounding rural area while the remainder live within town limits. As of June 2022, Ste. Rose School houses 197 students from Kindergarten to Senior 4. Our student population has self-declared at approximately 46% to be of Indigenous descent. We have a staff of 17 teachers and 10 support staff and provide a full academic program. The school offers a wide range of extra-curricular activities including athletics, senior band, yearbook and a breakfast program. Ste. Rose School has an active parent committee and student council.

## SCHOOL PRIORITIES

- By June 2022, Ste. Rose students in Grades 9 - 11 will have a 75% pass rate on Turtle River School divisional exams.
- By June 2022, 80% of Ste. Rose students in Kindergarten to Grade Four will have improved one grade level in their reading assessments recorded in October 2020.
- By June 2021, 10% of Ste. Rose students in Grade 5 - 8 will have improved their personal well-being based on the TTFM survey.
