COURSE OVERVIEW

This is an introductory course to the study of Home Economics where you will develop skills for daily living. The course is divided into 2 components, Food and Nutrition and Sewing and Textiles. In the Foods component of the course, you will focus on developing healthy relationships with food. In the Clothing component, you will be introduced to the basic equipment and sewing techniques. You will begin to develop skills, knowledge and an understanding of the role that clothing and textiles play in our daily lives. The course will be 10 weeks in length.
